Highlights

Even as floodwaters from storms described as the worst in decades began to subside, residents in Malaysia were warned of the possibility of more destructive weather in the coming days. MERCY Malaysia's flood response efforts remain ongoing, with teams moving from one evacuation center to another to assess and address the specific needs of affected communities.

In Kedah and Terengganu, the flood response team has introduced Child-Friendly Activities (CFA) at evacuation centers to create safe spaces for children. These activities, which include coloring and outdoor physical games, provide children with an opportunity to play, express their emotions, and mitigate psychological trauma during such challenging times.

In Kelantan, the mobile clinic initiative continues to serve communities severely impacted by the floods, providing essential healthcare services to those with limited or no access to medical facilities. These clinics have become lifelines for many, delivering critical care in difficult circumstances. One of our mobile clinics in Tumpat reached 400 displaced residents at a remote evacuation center after navigating submerged roads and challenging terrain.

Meanwhile, teams remain active in Kelantan, Terengganu, and Kedah, with support from standby units in Kuala Lumpur and state chapters. Assessments have identified significant gaps in essential supplies, including mattresses, towels, toothbrushes, diapers, and cleaning materials, highlighting the urgent need for continued support.

With forecasts predicting another wave of flooding in the northeastern region, preparations are already underway to ensure MERCY Malaysia can respond swiftly to the evolving needs of affected communities.

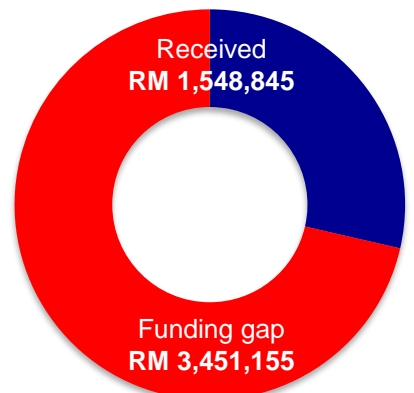

Food and Non-Food Items (NFI)



Supported by PKOB, APM, and MERCY Malaysia volunteers, the team distributed food and NFIs to Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) depot and evacuation centers assigned by PKOB in Kelantan and Terengganu.



Health



MERCY Malaysia's team in Kelantan conducted a mobile clinic in Tumpat and Pasir Mas, in support of the JKN efforts to provide essential medical care during the ongoing floods.



The team, made up of a medical doctor, nurse, pharmacist, and non-medical personnel, carried out health screenings and consultations at one of the most remote and difficult-to-access PPS.

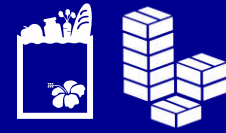

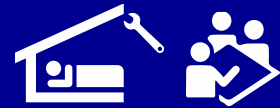
