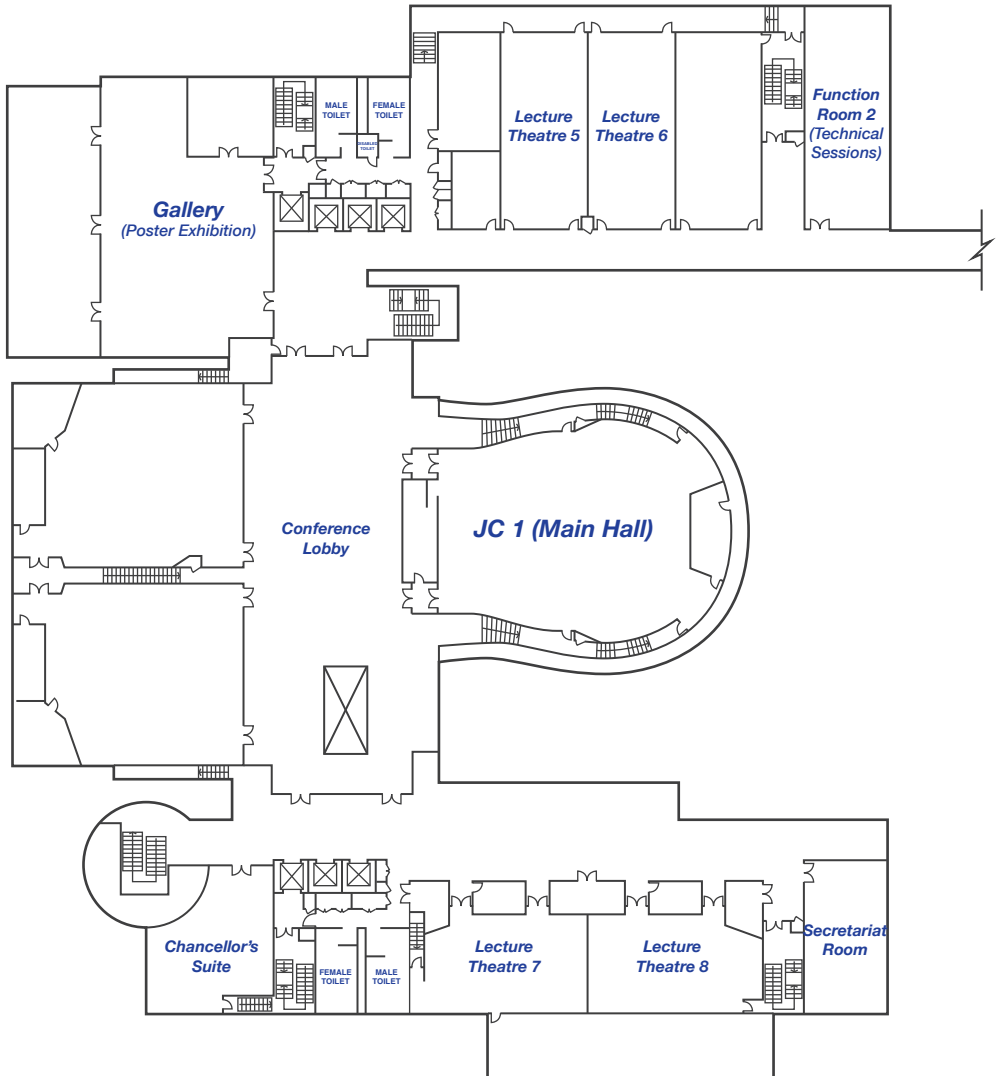

Psychosocial First Aid Workshop

Synopsis:

Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an evidence-informed modular approach for assisting people in the immediate aftermath of disaster and terrorism to reduce initial distress and to foster short and long-term adaptive functioning. The aim of this beginners' level workshop is to introduce to the participants the definition of PFA, the principles of PFA and its core actions. It will highlight the do's and don'ts when delivering PFA, taking into account cultural factors.

The workshop will also provide examples of effective reflective listening techniques when applying PFA to affected communities. Simulations will be conducted to allow participants to demonstrate their ability to transfer the basic core actions into practice. This workshop is suitable for any individual interested to learn more about effective helping behaviors during disasters.

TECHNICAL SESSION

Medical Deployment in Emergencies and Disasters

Synopsis:

Whenever a disaster strikes with multiple casualties, many organizations and NGOs scramble to deploy medical teams to the affected sites. But many teams are inadequately prepared in terms of staffing, medication, shelter, self-sufficiency in water and electricity, placing a burden on the affected population and using up vital local resources. The economic costs in the affected area becomes inflated with the presence of foreign teams and foreign dollars. Frequently, some medical practices are

sub-standard or too advanced and do not complement the local health governance and structure. More alarming is when foreign teams do not perform adequate needs assessment and render service based on their perception and not the actual needs of the affected population.

In disaster situations, emphasis is often on acute response with focus on saving lives and treating acute injuries. The World Health Organization (WHO) Emergency Medical Team has recognized medical rehabilitation as an integral part of medical response and has come up with rehabilitation guidelines recommending implementation and access to rehabilitation during all phases of disaster response.
